Investing in HTPS

It has been a very 'philanthropic' spring for Hill Top. The school has been fortunate to recently receive several major gifts. Last week, an anonymous donor made a significant and transformative donation to Hill Top. The donation of \$750,000 is the largest single donation in the school's history. It has been designated towards the expansion of Fisher Hall (high school). How should the new second floor be configured and used? Making it multi-purpose and perhaps open would provide us with the most flexibility as we strategically plan HT's future. We will be very thoughtful in how we approach this venture. This will involve forming a special project committee, gathering information, talking with our faculty, staff, parents, students and more, speaking with architects, touring other schools for ideas, and ensuring that what we do aligns with our mission and best serves our students.

In addition to this large gift, the school has also received major gifts for:

- Wellness Center a donation from the Hamilton Family Foundation has enabled us to create a Wellness Center in the Gym. The lower level under the new Brenneman Fitness Center now has a designated Wellness Classroom, a new Yoga/Mindfulness Room, and renovated restrooms.
- Mindfulness Program alumnus, Haynes Young '99, has donated funds for the creation of a Mindfulness Program to be implemented as part of our SEL programming.
- Golf Simulator families and staff have donated a beautiful Golf Simulator that will enable our golf team and gym classes to enhance their skills.
- Barrier/Fencing a friend of the school has made donations to replace both the aging gym stage barrier and fencing on campus. These new structures will be both functional and more aesthetically appealing.

We are very grateful to our donors who continue to invest in Hill Top!











In the Classroom & Beyond

Although the end of the school year is quickly approaching, our students are still working hard in and out of the classroom. Check out all the fun and educational activities they've been up to!

Roman Shields

Led by Mr. Cohen, our middle school students explored ancient Rome by creating their own Roman shields, merging art with history. Through this hands-on project, they learned about Roman military and cultural significance while expressing their creativity and teamwork. It was a great way to engage with history, making it tangible and exciting.



Flower Dissection

Students in Ms. Weiderhold's Life Science class delved into the natural world by dissecting flowers (found right on Hill Top's campus) to help study and learn a complex botanical lesson. Through this detailed project, they discovered the intricacies of plant anatomy and the functions of each part while honing their observational skills. A Social Emotional Learning (SEL) class harnessed their creativity and teamwork by building and racing model cars. This project, suggested by student Teddy Locke, helped them develop crucial skills like collaboration, problem-solving, and perseverance. Mr. Smallwood's Physical Education class hit the 'links' and worked on their birdie shot in PE! Through the sport of golf, students can improve focus, concentration, and social skills while gaining a sense of achievement and confidence.

Mastering Social Skills: PEERS® Summer Boot Camp

PEERS® summer boot camps are designed to teach evidence-based social skills, helping individuals foster meaningful connections and gain self-confidence in social situations.







These small groups cater to adolescents, teens, young adults, and adults. Attendees learn targeted skills through didactic instruction, role-play demonstrations, and behavioral rehearsal exercises.

Boot camp sessions run daily for two weeks (Monday through Friday from 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM), focusing on direct skill teaching. Skills covered include entering and exiting

conversations, using electronic communication, choosing appropriate friendships, organizing get-togethers, and handling disagreements.




